A Note from the President & CEO

Dear Friends-

Back in 2022, we changed our name. In 2023, we delivered on the promise that name broadcasted—we founded the Melrose Place apartment building located in Walnut Hills. Melrose is the culmination of a decade of work to increase housing programming at Found House IHN, and the start of a new chapter as a housing provider.

Found House IHN's Leadership Team:

Stacey Burge, President & CEO Jessica Mount, VP of Operations Kristie Roberson, VP of Programs Kelly Myers, Services Director Joberto Lewis, Shelter Director Garrett Parsons, Services Director Jamie Green, Development Director Suzanne Scott-Ludeman, PSH Services Director Jewel Dailey, RRH Services Director Linda Garret, HR Manager Over the last ten years, we tripled the number of families served annually. We have done this in response to the needs of the community. A 2024 Housing Report from Harvard University found that across the country, 60% of residents are renters. Of those, 37% are in households that make less than \$30,000 annually—precisely the families served by Found House IHN and impacted so starkly by lack of habitable, affordable options.

As more families in Greater Cincinnati have struggled to make budgets work with rising housing costs and stagnant wages, we added scattered-site Rapid Rehousing and Permanent Supportive Housing, Aftercare, and prevention programming to assist.

We have expanded options for families while sticking to our guiding organizational principle that families define themselves—whether parents, children, other relatives, pets, or chosen family are part of the household. We believe home is having one's whole family safe and together. Housing by itself cannot meet needs, or be successful, if it is not home.

This decade of growth would not have been possible without community partners and supporters that are too many to name. Faith communities, pet program volunteers, fellow non-profits, donors at all levels, neighbors, businesses, and families.

Thank you to all of you for helping deliver the promise of home.

Dear Found House IHN Family of Supporters-

I am so excited to be serving with an organization that lives its mission so effectively and enthusiastically. Our mission is to house families and we have done just that, assisting nearly 400 families this year and opening the Melrose Place apartment building.

We have grown significantly over the last decade in response to the needs presented to us, maintaining a 90% housing success rate across programs.

We have also worked hard to continue sheltering families on an emergency basis. Shelter is not an endpoint, but an important step for many on the path to regaining housing stability.


During this summer of 2023, nearly 80% of eligible families seeking shelter were turned away due to lack of space. At the same time, Found House IHN's capacity was reduced by 50% compared to pre-pandemic levels due to reductions in available congregational host sites. We know the shelter model must change to keep up with community need. The next couple of years will see new developments and transitions. Your ongoing support will be needed more than ever to continue to house families and build sustainable futures.

Thank you for helping us build a community where all families are safely housed.

Our mission is to provide shelter, housing, and support to families experiencing housing insecurity--to strengthen those services through interfaith and community partnerships--in pursuit of a community where all families have access to affordable housing.





Emergency Shelter combines communitysupport with professional services to assist families experiencing homelessness.

This includes overnight shelter, three meals per day, developing a support plan, and ongoing services leading to stable housing. "For me, one of the keys to service is meeting people where they are in life and offering them something that gives them at least a moment of less anxiety and an understanding that they are seen and cared about; Found House IHN provides an opportunity to do that for families lacking secure housing"

Housing Families

Housing Programs and Supportive Services:

FHIHN's services and programs have evolved into Found House IHN's three pillars of service - Shelter, Housing, and Specialized Supports, designed to provide hospitality to meet basic needs, keep families together, help families find and retain stable housing, and build a community where no family has to go without a roof overhead.

The Rapid Rehousing Program:

Families in financial crisis often face obstacles and lack resources that prevent them from searching for affordable housing in a short period of time. FHIHN caseworkers quickly link families to housing, providing case management services and assistance with deposits, rent, and utilities for a limited timeframe.

Of the families that entered FHIHN's rapid housing program, **89% exited with stable housing in 2023.**

KEYS Program

Parents in shelter ages 18-24 are able to access the KEYS program. In a partnership between FHIHN, Lighthouse Youth & Family Services, the Family Housing Partnership, and Strategies to End Homelessness, KEYS offers life and financial skills to youth experiencing homelessness. in addition to rapid rehousing services.

In 2023, KEYS participants total income increased by 48%.

Child Enrichment Services

FHIHN's Child Enrichment program offers educational support, play and structural activities, and developmental assessments to reduce risks and build brighter futures with lasting positive impacts.

In 2023, the Child Enrichment program served 74 children in emergency shelter and Melrose Place PSH programs.

Aftercare Program:

Aftercare is a homelessness prevention program, designed to provide a safety net for FHIHN clients who have exited one of FHIHN's programs. Aftercare provides timely support for short-term or one-time expenses needed to prevent a return to homelessness.

In addition to financial assistance, Aftercare provides case management services to assist with problem solving, resource development, referrals, and general support to see the family through the crisis and back to a sense of stability.

In 2023, aftercare prevented 79 families from losing their housing.

92 % of Aftercare Families have maintained stable housing for over 2 years.



Permanent Supportive Housing

What is Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH)?

- PSH is a community-based way to assist people with disabilities who don't have stable housing.
- It provides housing along with services to support their needs.
- People in PSH have case managers who help with things like healthcare, addiction recovery, job skills, and finances.

In 2023, 97 % of families in PSH maintained their housing.

Why build Melrose Place?

A study conducted in 2017 by the Community Building Institute at Xavier University revealed that Hamilton County is grappling with a shortage of 40,000 affordable housing units for low-income households.


In 2019, 60 families qualified for supportive housing, and only 12 were matched.

In January, Found House completed the construction of a 26-unit, pet friendly apartment building for families re-entering housing.

Melrose Place boosted FHIHN's Permanent Supportive Housing capacity by 50%.

Over the past decade, the Permanent Supportive Housing program at Found House IHN has more than tripled capacity.

Pet Support Program

FHNIN's Pet Support Program reunites pets to their owners after temporary loss of housing - instead of surrendering them in order to receive services.

Taking in animals is one of the ways FHNIN has supported its mission of keeping the entire family together - by hosting pets until families are able to enter stable housing again.

Did you know?

Found House IHN was the first human shelter to include pets in the Cincinnati area - a model that is now beginning to be copied by other shelters.

In 2023, 310 pets were temporarily


housed or provided resources by FHIHN's Pet Support program.

Pets were provided 179 Pets provided with supportive resources in 2023



Despite increased capacity, 618 pets in need of temporary shelter were turned away due to lack of capacity and resources in 2023 (a 35% increase from 2022).




Decade of Growth:
